Our first speaker was Cathy Tiggs, LSW, from Cleveland HTC. She shared many mental health facts, as well as how our community can cope with bleeding disorders.



Advocacy in Action

Washington Days Inspires Advocates

Each March, volunteers from around the country come together to learn more about advocacy and meet with their representatives to discuss the needs of the bleeding disorders community. Like last year, the big topics of discussion included continued funding for HTCs and the need for a federal ban on Copay Accumulator Adjuster Programs (CAAPs) through support of the *HELP Copays Act*.

Copay Accumulator Adjuster Programs create an issue because they say that copay assistance doesn't count towards a person's out of pocket maximum or deductible. This means that after assistance from the pharmaceutical manufacturer runs out, patients will still need to pay up to their out-of-pocket max before their insurance will kick in and cover the rest, leaving medications too costly for many people to afford.

West Virginia has a ban on CAAPs programs, but that doesn't cover all types of insurance. So, while many West Virginians are protected, there are still many people struggling to access their medication. Federal legislation through support of the *HELP Copays Act* would eliminate this issue for everyone. Learn more about the *HELP Copays Act* HERE.
